The 2015 Board Retreat Decision The ReUse Store: Stepping Back and Moving Forward

Everybody loves the ReUse Store. I know I do. Lots of us shop there for those hard to find repair things, great deals, or simply needed items we can't get elsewhere for the price. Lots of us go in just to browse around and visit with Verne. For a good while we had Kevin, who could just look at some obscure piece of metal and tell you what it was and how it was used.

At our annual board retreat last year, we had to let Kevin go because the store just wasn't making enough money. Verne took over as volunteer manager, and with the help of a few other die hard volunteers, has kept the store open. We don't have enough volunteers and sadly, the store is still not bringing in enough to justify the costs needed to run it, so this year at our annual retreat, we decided to close the store by or before December 31, 2015.

It was a very hard decision, but we are excited about what the freed up resources and money could do in our community. We have done a lot of greater blessing projects in the last year as that is where we are seeing need, and what a blessing those greater blessing projects are! One community member has a new roof and cut his heating costs in half, another's yard doesn't flood, and yet another large family has a safe, affordable home. We get as much as we give on these projects, as there is always much gratitude.

We are also hoping to build another home, so volunteers don't despair! We need you, and we are always looking for more.

We feel that by directing the volunteers and money to some of these areas can bring more benefit to the people in our community. The fate of the ReUse building is still uncertain; we are going to stop taking donations other than large ticket items we can move quickly. At some point we may have to liquidate the inventory, but don't worry it will be well advertised! We promise to keep you posted.

[We are obviously still mulling over various options for the store with the clear understanding that Verne is definitely retiring by the end of the year—his energy gauge is long past empty and he has been running on pure determination. As we truly appreciate the value of the store in our community, we would like to see it continue. So, we would appreciate constructive ideas.--Judy]

Beware of this kind of rip-off.

I received a call from one of our Greater Blessings

homeowners who had nowhere else to turn. She had been trying to have her home insurance renewed last year but was told that her home needed a new paint job and windows updated. She had contracted with a fellow, who claimed to have worked with Habitat for Humanity, to power-wash, scrape, and paint her home several months ago. She had paid him cash. She complained when she saw the mess he left. He walked off after threatening her—hence no names are used here.

So, I contacted the Mark Thyr Insurance Agency to do a review since Mark does represent several of our homeowners with their insurance. The photo at the left is one he took. The paint was so thin that you can see the wood grain where the strips of old paint hang down. Mark also noted that insurance companies are opposed to the use of plastic over the outside of windows.

Our Greater Blessings Committee members went back to see what we can do. Clint Kunze, from Shoshone Mt. Retreat, and Kerry Sawyer, from Shoshone Glass came also. Clint noted that the paint that needs to be removed will have to be done by adults since there is a danger of it being lead paint. After the walls are cleaned off (as they were supposed to have been), then his youth crews can do the painting. They will start arriving at camp this spring in June. Kerry said that Shoshone Glass will help with storm windows which should make a significant difference in her heat bill.

I am hoping that we will be able to schedule some RV Builders to help with this project. We have not invited them for several years since it was difficult to schedule enough projects consecutively to keep them busy for a week or two. The last time was when we were renovating a home for the Kriedeman family in Smelterville.

I spoke with a homeowner in Silverton, Nick Berryhill, who is bringing suit against this man. Much of the funds he put up for materials for a new addition disappeared. He didn't even get a building permit. Since the contractor walked off two years ago and left the area open, now black mold is causing a big problem. Mr. Berryhill has been trying to finish his construction on his own.

Please check with local building inspectors before hiring someone to do your work. They can definitely warn you if it is someone they know about.






