Landing Some Expertise

Duane Little has seen some changes in the almost two decades he has served on the board of directors for Silver Valley Fuller Center for Housing. He joined the board in 2003.

The former Shoshone County assessor knows about land values, and he has seen a large increase in those values over recent years. That makes it difficult to help provide affordable housing for low-income people. Wages in the area have not been keeping up, he noted. That increases the need for affordable housing while making it more difficult to provide.

One of the answers, he suggests, might be something along the line of townhouses or row-

houses that require less land. In addition to reducing construction costs and land costs, having the shared structure wall between them helps reduce heating and cooling costs. This method seems to be helping provide more affordable housing in other areas, he noted.

"We've been pretty lucky. We've been given some land in the past," he said.

Fuller Center has those vacant lots available now.

But building materials are still expensive, he added, although the price of lumber has come down from its peak. Finding sufficient funds to build any house has proven to be a difficult reach. And to build multi-family structures, while reducing the overall cost to a family, still creates greater expenses for the organization since it would involve more than one home. Fuller Center would pay the constructions costs up front and the qualifying person purchasing one of the homes would pay an interest-free mortgage to pay back those construction costs. Coming up with the funds for the initial construction of such a project is challenging.

"You have to have enough people that can afford it," he added.



In the meantime, Fuller Center has not been standing still. Little noted that the Greater Blessing program has been very active in helping low-income homeowners with repairs they might not be able to afford, such as on roofs or stairways. And that has provided rewards in itself to both recipients and the Fuller Center volunteers.

"It's been a great experience, but I'm getting to the age where I'm going to retire pretty soon," Little said.
