#### The Very Busy Month of June

First, thirty six Fuller Center for Housing Bike Adventurers arrived on the  $14^{th}$ , worked on our projects the  $15^{th}$ , attended various churches on the  $16^{th}$ , and traveled onward on the  $17^{th}$ .

Next, we held our 22<sup>nd</sup> Ride the Wall, bike event which looped from The Snake Pit to Cataldo, up the CCC Road and back to The Snake Pit via the Enaville Silver Bridge. It was held as usual on the evening of June 21<sup>st</sup>, the longest day of the year.




