Our Housing Ministry Continues with the Dedication of John Delaney's home

With a smile from ear to ear, John "Boy" Delaney (who likes the Waltons) greeted family and friends to the dedication of his home—our 20th here in the Silver Valley.

Since the sky was cloudy, Master of Ceremonies, Colleen Rosson, had set up awnings in the front yard which we fortunately did not need. A nice group of well wishers gathered outside for the ceremony and were invited inside to view John Boy's 50s/60s décor. He has been working with us for three years for this moment.

The house had been vacant for 10 years prior to its renovation. We appreciate all the volunteer work put into it including help from all the Idaho Servant Adventurer youth groups with Clint Kunze at Shoshone Mountain Retreat; the Fuller Center Bike Adventurers who worked for a day on their way across the US; Rick Gilbert; Jim Taylor; Gordon Milholland of G & M Electric; Jeff Crawford and sons of System Designs; Trisha Waldo; Kathy McPeak; and John Boy's anonymous neighbor who helped sand the floors.

During the ceremony, Pastor Cory Berti blessed the house and presented a Bible to John Boy. Verne Blalack and Rick Gilbert presented a key and Linda Miller sang "The House that Built Me."

Ladies from the Cornerstone Church, Pauline Norris, Lois Dahlberg and Jill Jackson, brought a basket of household staples and a broom. Shirley McClain and Marta Arthurs, members of the Silver Valley Stitchers, presented a cross stitched home sampler.

Ellie Arguimbau presented John Boy with a certificate to cover the cost of repair of an electric bicycle he uses to patrol the Trail of the Coeur d'Alene's where he helps keep the trail clean and helps folks on the trail. The certificate is from the Fuller Center, the Greater Silver Valley Chamber of Commerce, and the Friends of the Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes. She also presented the annual bike pass for using his electric bike to do his job.

Colleen Rosson, who is also John Boy's sponsor, thanked Benjamin Allen and Silver Valley Law; and the wonderful ladies of Shoshone Co. who made sure that his deed was recorded timely and correctly.

She also thanked Jeff Waechter of Panhandle Linen who donated the use of carpet runners to protect the floors during the ceremony.

The Fuller Center is accepting applications for lowincome new homeowners and for their Greater Blessings program working with homeowners who cannot afford or are incapable of doing their own repairs. They are looking for donations of a home or to purchase an inexpensive home they could renovate in flat areas for a lady who has been approved as a homeowner but cannot navigate a hillside or many stairs.

DISTANCE: Approximately 13 miles.

EQUIPMENT: Mountain & Hybrid bicycles recommended. ANSI or Bell helmets mandatory for all riders.

Recommend participants have a bicycle safety inspection prior to event.

ENTRY: \$35 - payable to Silver Valley Fuller Center for Housing. Must be postmarked by June 7h.

LATE ENTRY: After June 7th, or in person 4-6 pm on race day - \$40. Late registrations will not be guaranteed shirts the day of the race.

CHECK-IN: Thursday, June 21st, 4-6 pm. The Snake Pit outdoor pavilion. Packets & drinks will be picked up.

PRE-EVENT: MEETING & START: 6:05 pm - parking lot at Enaville Trailhead of the "Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes", across the road from The Snake Pit. Less experienced riders start at 6:15, others at 6:30 pm. Course closes at 8 pm.

FINISH: . The Snake Pit.

at check-in. PARKING INFO: Come early; park in designated areas.

Please keep the front parking lot clear for patrons—please!

COURSE INFORMATION: - From Enaville to Cataldo: approximately 5 miles of paved trail. -The Wall: approximately 8 miles -.one-lane, gravel, dirt road, rocky on the uphill (1-mile of uphill is rigorous), downhill is a typical logging road with some sharp corners.-.speeds up to 20-30 mph may be reached. Off the Wall to Enaville: approximately ½ mile alongside the Cd'A River Road. Traffic should be minimal on the paved sections, and the rigorous portion of the Wall will be closed to all but emergency traffic and course marshals from 6-8:15 pm. - Volunteers will be on the course to flag, give directions, and indicate upcoming turns on the downhill portion. Aid station with water on top of the wall.

Celebrate the longest day of the year by participating in a non-competitive 13-mile bicycle

ride from the Enaville Trailhead to The Snake Pit via a portion of the lovely "Trail of the Cd'As"

from Enaville to Cataldo, then onto the historic CCC-Wall Ridge route, a picturesque road that

winds along and above the Cd'A River beginning at Cataldo and ending at Enaville on the North

Fork of the Cd'A River.

COURSE INSPECTION: The course is on public roads and is open for pre-event rides. Please be aware that the course is a public road, people live along the route, and traffic laws and rules do apply!




