### **Brian's Trailer Update**

Significant progress was made again this month on Brian's trailer in Osburn. Jeff Crawford removed the existing furnace, and installed a new electric furnace in the trailer. Despite the progress made last month on the sheetrock, there was still some sheetrock that needed to be removed and replaced. Don Mathews finished replacing the sheetrock in the closet so that the hot water heater can be installed. In addition, the south wall in the bathroom needed to be reinforced and sheetrocked, which Don completed as well. He also did sheetrock repair in the hall where the washer and dryer cupboards sat.

The trailer also needed extensive electrical work. Several electrical outlets were not working at all in the bedroom, kitchen and bathroom. Almost every single switch, fixture and outlet in the entire trailer needed to be replaced. Some did not meet code (need GFI in the bathroom and kitchen) and some were just worn out and dangerous.

The Braunstein family returned this month to further assist with the remodel of the trailer. They made significant progress including:

- Painted much of the trailer
- Installed new kitchen cabinets
- Installed new kitchen sink and faucet
- Installed new microwave and range


