Shauna Hillman, curator of the Northern Pacific Railroad Depot Museum, gave Linda Amonson, Kay Baker, and me, Judy Blalack, a tour of the museum when we were soliciting prizes for our upcoming fund raisers (the Walk-A-Thon and Christmas raffle). We all laughed with Linda as she tried on May Hutton's stylish hat and were impressed with the display.

Strong Women of Wallace is the current exhibit in the Northern Pacific Railroad Depot Museum in Wallace. This exhibit is funded by the Idaho Humanities Council and the NP Depot Foundation to promote the oral histories of our families in our communities.

We are celebrating the women who worked to make Wallace and the Coeur d'Alene Mining District a forward thinking and sustainable "mining camp". The five women we are highlighting this season are Lana Turner, born in Wallace and campaigned for female actors equal wages in Hollywood, Dolores Arnold, owner of the Lux and Luxette Rooms, contributed to the Wallace Community. She said, "You do not always have to obey the laws, but you do have to follow the rules." Miss Nancy Lee Hanson, worked single handedly to list the entire community on the National Register of Historic Places. Miss Nellie Stockbridge worked for the TN Barnard as a photographer. Nellie packed a camera gear underground to record the mining industry and climbed the mountains to record the growing community. The Stockbridge collection is a complete record of the citizens and business growth of Wallace. Our fifth Strong Woman of Wallace, is May Arkwright Hutton, a champion for women's equality, children, and the labor of industry. Hutton made a fortune with the Hercules Mine in Burke.

The NPR Depot Museum welcomes you to visit us this summer to participate in the hands-on exhibits. You may sit next to a "sporting woman", try on a May Hutton stylish hat and take your picture with May Arkwright Hutton. Please come remember the rails in the NPR Depot Museum and play with the trains.

Miss Vicki Allmann will present May Arkwright Hutton as a lecture in the Women's Waiting Room on Thursday, September 20, 2018 at the NPR Depot Museum at 6:00 p.m.
